Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 4437 (Border Protection, Antiterrorism, and Illegal Immigration Control Act of 2005).

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 15, 2005:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 109-347, by Mr. Gingrey.
- **Dec 15, 2005:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 4437 with 2 hours of general debate. Measure will be considered read. Specified amendments are in order.
- **Dec 15, 2005:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 132.
- **Dec 15, 2005:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H11H11670-11678)
- **Dec 15, 2005:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 610.
- **Dec 15, 2005:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H11677)
- **Dec 15, 2005:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - The Chair put the question on adoption of the resolution and by voice vote announced that the noes had prevailed. Mr. Hastings (WA) demanded the yeas and nays which were ordered, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of the resolution until later in the legislative day.
- **Dec 15, 2005:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H11798-11799)
- **Dec 15, 2005:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 220 - 206 (Roll no. 636).(text: CR H11670)
