Sets forth the rule for consideration of the resolution (H.Res. 612) expressing the commitment of the House of Representatives to achieving victory in Iraq.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 16, 2005:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 109-348, by Mr. Cole (OK).
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Sec. 2. On the first legislative day of the second session of the One Hundred Ninth Congress, the House shall not conduct organizational or legislative business
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 133.
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H11885-11888, H11893)
- **Dec 16, 2005:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 619.
- **Dec 16, 2005:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question on the resolution until later in the legislative day.
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H11893, H11902-11903)
- **Dec 16, 2005:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 200 (Roll no. 644). (consideration: CR H11893, H11902-11903)
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 217 - 202 (Roll no. 645).(text: CR H11885)
- **Dec 16, 2005:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
