Encourages the President to issue a proclamation calling upon employers, labor organizations, veterans service organizations, and Federal, State, and local governmental agencies to lend their support to increase employment of men and women who have served in the armed forces.

- **Mar 17, 2005:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **Feb 15, 2005:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 15, 2005:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Feb 14, 2005:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E227)
