Summary (as of Jan 24, 2005)

Psychiatric and Psychological Examinations Act of 2005 - Amends the Federal criminal code to allow the psychiatric or psychological examinations required for the determination of mental capacity to stand trial and the determination of the existence of insanity at the time of an offense to be conducted by clinical social workers.
