Summary (as of Mar 5, 2008)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 1424 (Paul Wellstone Mental Health and Addiction Equity Act of 2007).

Actions Timeline

- Mar 5, 2008: By direction of the Committee on Rules, Ms Castor called up H. Res. 1014 for its immediate consideration.
- Mar 5, 2008: POINT OF ORDER The Broun (GA) raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 1014 because it violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the desposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H. Res. 1014. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question of consideration.
- Mar 5, 2008: On motion to consider the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 215 192, 1 Present (Roll no. 94). (consideration: CR H1259-1262)
- Mar 5, 2008: Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H1259-1272)
- Mar 5, 2008: DEBATE The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1014.
- Mar 5, 2008: On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 215 195 (Roll no. 95). (consideration: CR H1271)
- Mar 5, 2008: Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 209 198 (Roll no. 96).(text: CR H1259)
- Mar 5, 2008: Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.

- Mar 4, 2008: Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 1424 with 2 hours of general debate. Previous question shall be considered as ordered without intervening motions except motion to recommit with or without instructions. Measure will be considered read. Bill is closed to amendments.
