Summary (as of Feb 15, 2007)

Requires the Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy to: (1) use the National Science and Technology Council as a forum for coordination and collaboration among federal agencies in developing best practices for the support of advanced research instrumentation and facilities at academic institutions; (2) encourage the development of centralized programs for the support of advanced research instrumentation and facilities at all federal research agencies that sponsor research at academic institutions; and (3) develop and implement policies for federal support for advanced research instrumentation and facilities as described in this Act. Requires such forum to also provide advice to the Director in developing those policies.

Actions Timeline

- Jun 5, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Higher Education, Lifelong Learning, and Competitiveness.
- Feb 21, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Research and Science Education.
- Feb 15, 2007: Introduced in House
- Feb 15, 2007: Referred to the Committee on Science and Technology, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
