Summary (as of Feb 15, 2007)

Professional Driver Background Check Efficiency Act of 2007 - Amends federal transportation law to revise background records check requirements with respect to the issuance of a motor vehicle license for the transportation of hazardous materials to: (1) impose a fee of not more than \$50 upon the applicant to cover the costs of the background check; and (2) authorize the costs for such background checks be reimbursed to the state.

Actions Timeline

- Feb 23, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Transportation Security and Infrastructure Protection.
- Feb 16, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- Feb 15, 2007: Introduced in House
- Feb 15, 2007: Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
