Summary (as of Jan 5, 2007)

Constitutional Amendment - Declares that the Constitution shall not be construed to prohibit individual or group prayer in public schools or other public institutions.

Prohibits the United States or any state from requiring any person to participate in prayer or from prescribing the content of any prayer.
