Summary (as of Feb 16, 2007)

Iraq Contingency Planning Act - Requires the President by June 30, 2007, to report to the House and Senate Armed Services Committees detailing U.S. and U.S. Armed Forces contingency plans to respond to the following three scenarios regarding future developments in Iraq as identified by the most recent National Intelligence Estimate on Iraq: (1) chaos leading to partition; (2) emergence of a Shia strongman; and (3) anarchic fragmentation of power.

Actions Timeline

- Mar 20, 2007: Committee Hearings Held.
- Feb 16, 2007: Introduced in House
- Feb 16, 2007: Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E378-379)
- Feb 16, 2007: Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
