Res. 1434, the Chair put the question on adoption of ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Session demanded the yeas and nays, and further proceedings on the question of adoption were postponed until later in the legislative day. (consideration: CR H8179-8180)
- Sep 16, 2008: Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H8179-8180)
- Sep 16, 2008: On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 183 (Roll no. 597). (text: CR H8168)
- Sep 16, 2008: Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H8168)
- Sep 16, 2008: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H8168)
- Sep 16, 2008: Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- Sep 15, 2008: Introduced in House
- Sep 15, 2008: The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 110-852, by Mr. McGovern.
- Sep 15, 2008: All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. The amendment recommended by the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted in the House and in the Committee of the Whole.
- Sep 15, 2008: Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 264.
