To amend the Forest Service use and occupancy permit program to restore the authority of the Secretary of Agriculture to utilize the special use permit fees collected by the Secretary in connection with the establishment and operation of marinas in units of the National Forest System derived from the public domain, and for other purposes.

Summary (as of Apr 18, 2007)

Amends the Forest Service use and occupancy permit program to require amounts collected in connection with the issuance of a special use permit for a marina at a unit of the National Forest System (NFS) derived from the public domain to be deposited in an existing special account in the Treasury established for the Secretary of Agriculture for specified recreation management purposes.

Actions Timeline

- **May 4, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Department Operations, Oversight, Nutrition and Forestry.
- **Apr 24, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands.
- **Apr 18, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 18, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Agriculture, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
