Summary (as of May 1, 2007)

Authorizes appropriations for FY2008 for enhancing the integrity of the United States against the threat of terrorism.

Requires such funds to be used by the Secretary of Homeland Security to reimburse a state or political subdivision for expenses incurred when law enforcement officers or employees of such state or subdivision receive training to perform border security and immigration enforcement functions.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 25, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship, Refugees, Border Security, and International Law.
- **May 5, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border, Maritime, and Global Counterterrorism.
- **May 1, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **May 1, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
