Summary (as of Jan 4, 2007)

Deficit Accountability Act of 2007 - Amends the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 to provide that pay for Members of Congress may not be increased by any adjustment scheduled to take effect in a calendar year if the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) determines there was a deficit in the preceding fiscal year.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 5, 2007:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E22-23)
- **Jan 4, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 4, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
