Truth in Cigarette Labeling Act of 2008 - Prohibits a cigarette manufacturer from making any claims or other representations based on data derived from a cigarette testing method established by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) before enactment of this Act. Treats any violation as an unfair or deceptive act or practice under the Federal Trade Commission Act and requires enforcement by the FTC.

- **Sep 26, 2008:** Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Reported by Senator Inouye without amendment. With written report No. 110-512.
- **Sep 26, 2008:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 1095.
- **May 15, 2008:** Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Ordered to be reported without amendment favorably.
- **Mar 3, 2008:** Introduced in Senate
- **Mar 3, 2008:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.
