Summary (as of Jun 28, 2007)

Amends federal postal law to make cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, and roll-your-own-tobacco nonmailable.

Requires tobacco products attempted to be mailed to be disposed of as the Postal Service directs.

Provides a civil penalty for each mailing violation.

Actions Timeline

- Jul 6, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- Jun 28, 2007: Introduced in House
- Jun 28, 2007: Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
