Recognizes the necessity for the United States to maintain its significant leadership role in improving the health and promoting the resiliency of coral reef ecosystems by strengthening awareness about ecological, economic, social, and cultural values of coral reefs and associated ecosystems, improving understanding of coral reef threats and generating practical and innovative solutions, and initiating development and implementation of effective management strategies for the conservation and sustainable use of those ecosystems.

- **May 21, 2008:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR 5/19/2008 H4066)
- **May 21, 2008:** On motion to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR 5/19/2008 H4066)
- **May 21, 2008:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **May 19, 2008:** Ms. Bordallo moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.
- **May 19, 2008:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H4066-4067)
- **May 19, 2008:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Con. Res. 300.
- **May 19, 2008:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Issa objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
- **Feb 19, 2008:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, and Oceans.
- **Feb 15, 2008:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 15, 2008:** Referred to the House Committee on Natural Resources.
