Trails Act Technical Correction Act of 2007 - Prescribes the times for filing a suit and for commencing a civil action by the owner of property subject to an interim use of railroad right-of-way for damage claims brought against the United States.

- **Jul 31, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands.
- **Jul 24, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 24, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
