Summary (as of Jul 26, 2007)

Respecting the Civil Liberties of America's Vulnerable Act - Amends the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004 to provide for an immigrant rights advocate on the Privacy and Civil Liberties Oversight Board.

Expresses the sense of Congress that the Board should meet with representatives of various U.S. immigrant communities before each Board report to Congress.

## Actions Timeline

- **Aug 7, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Management, Investigations, and Oversight.
- **Jul 26, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 26, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, Homeland Security, and Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
