Summary (as of Aug 1, 2007)

Anti-Terrorism Act of 2007 - Provides that no federal agency shall prohibit an airline pilot, copilot, or navigator, or law enforcement person specifically detailed for protection of an aircraft, from carrying a firearm.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 7, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Transportation Security and Infrastructure Protection.
- **Aug 2, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Aviation.
- **Aug 1, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Aug 1, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
