Summary (as of Sep 16, 2008)

Bars the promulgation or enforcement of any regulation that prohibits an individual from possessing a firearm, including an assembled or functional firearm, in any unit of the National Park System or the National Wildlife Refuge System if: (1) the individual is not otherwise prohibited by law from possessing the firearm; and (2) the possession of the firearm is in compliance with the law of the state relating to the possession of a firearm in a state park, state wildlife refuge, or similar unit of state land in the state in which the unit or that portion thereof is located.

- Sep 16, 2008: Introduced in Senate
- Sep 16, 2008: Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Original measure reported to Senate by Senator Bingaman. Without written report.
- Sep 16, 2008: Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 1007.
