Summary (as of Nov 1, 2007)

Honors the sacrifice of those born in the "notch" years of 1917 through 1926.

Recognizes the differences in Social Security benefits calculated for those born in 1917 and the years following, as compared with those born between 1911 and 1916.

Expresses regret that there has been no resolution to the satisfaction of millions of seniors born from 1917 through 1926.

Calls for corrective legislation similar to bills introduced in the Senate in the 105th through 108th Congresses to address the "notch" benefit disparity.
