Flu Vaccine Availability Act of 2008 - Directs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to conduct a demonstration project providing influenza vaccinations to all kindergarten through grade eight students in one or more low-income metropolitan schools for the purpose of studying and reducing any socioeconomic disparities in the provision of such vaccinations.

Actions Timeline

- Feb 5, 2008: Referred to the Subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary, and Secondary Education.
- Dec 4, 2007: Introduced in House
- Dec 4, 2007: Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- Dec 4, 2007: Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
