Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 3074 (Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2008).

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 23, 2007:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H8245-8252)
- **Jul 23, 2007:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 558.
- **Jul 23, 2007:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 558, the Chair put the question on adoption of ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Sessions demanded the yeas and nays and the chair postponed further proceedings on adoption of ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **Jul 23, 2007:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H8255-8256)
- **Jul 23, 2007:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 210 - 179 (Roll no. 690). (consideration: CR H8255-8256)
- **Jul 23, 2007:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H8245)
- **Jul 23, 2007:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H8245)
- **Jul 23, 2007:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jul 19, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 19, 2007:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 110-242, by Mr. Welch (VT).
- **Jul 19, 2007:** All points of order against consideration of the bill except those arising under clause 9 or 10 or rule XXI. The bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule.
