Medicare Remote Monitoring Access Act of 2008 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to cover remote patient management services for certain chronic health conditions.

Directs the Secretary to establish a demonstration project for evaluating the impact and benefits of covering under the Medicare program remote patient management services for certain chronic health conditions.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 16, 2008:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 14, 2008:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 10, 2008:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 10, 2008:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
