Get Real Incentives to Drive Plug-in Act - Directs the Secretary of Transportation to establish: (1) a program to make grants to motor vehicle manufacturers for research and development on plug-in hybrid electric vehicles; (2) a pilot project on how best to integrate plug-in hybrid electric vehicles into the electric power grid and into the overall transportation infrastructure; and (3) a test site for the advancement of battery technologies for such vehicles.

Amends the Internal Revenue Code to establish a tax credit for taxpayers who own or lease a new plug-in hybrid motor vehicle.

Requires at least 10% of the motor vehicles purchased by a federal agency in any fiscal year to be plug-in hybrid electric vehicles.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 23, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Government Management, Organization, and Procurement.
- **Jan 31, 2007:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Technology and Innovation, and in addition to the Subcommittee on Energy and Environment, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
- **Jan 29, 2007:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H975-978)
- **Jan 19, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 19, 2007:** Referred to the Committee on Science and Technology, and in addition to the Committees on Ways and Means, and Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
