- **Sep 7, 2007:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 636.
- **Sep 7, 2007:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H10255)
- **Sep 7, 2007:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 636, the Chair put the question of agreeing to the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Lincoln Diaz-Balart demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of agreeing to the resolution until later in the legislative day.
- **Sep 7, 2007:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H10258-10259)
- **Sep 7, 2007:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 222 - 181 (Roll no. 860).(text: CR H10249)
- **Sep 7, 2007:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 222 - 181 (Roll no. 860). (text: CR H10249)
- **Sep 7, 2007:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Sep 6, 2007:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 6, 2007:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 110-319, by Mr. Welch (VT).
- **Sep 6, 2007:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary, now printed in the bill shall be considered as an original bill.
- **Sep 6, 2007:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 108.
