Summary (as of Jun 26, 2008)

Energy Markets Emergency Act of 2008 - Directs the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) to utilize all its authority, including its emergency powers, to: (1) curb immediately the role of excessive speculation in any contract market within its jurisdiction and control on or through which energy futures or swaps are traded; and (2) eliminate excessive speculation, price distortion, sudden or unreasonable fluctuations or unwarranted changes in prices, or other unlawful activity that is causing major market disturbances that prevent the market from accurately reflecting the forces of supply and demand for energy commodities.

- Jul 7, 2008: Read the first time. Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under Read the First Time.
- Jun 26, 2008: Introduced in House
- Jun 26, 2008: Referred to the House Committee on Agriculture.
- Jun 26, 2008: Mr. Peterson (MN) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- Jun 26, 2008: Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H6103-6110)
- Jun 26, 2008: DEBATE The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 6377.
- Jun 26, 2008: At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
