Extends through calendar year 2013 the authority of the United States Supreme Court Police to protect court officials off the Supreme Court grounds.

Changes the title of the Administrative Assistant to the Chief Justice to Counselor to the Chief Justice.

- **Sep 15, 2008:** Mr. Scott (VA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Sep 15, 2008:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H8085-8086)
- **Sep 15, 2008:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 6855.
- **Sep 15, 2008:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Issa objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
- **Sep 10, 2008:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 10, 2008:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
