Healthy Communities Water Supply Act of 2007 - Amends the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to authorize appropriations for the pilot program for alternative water source projects. Requires the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in making grants under the program, to consider whether a project is located in an area which is served by a public water system serving 10,000 individuals or fewer.

Prohibits the funds authorized by this Act from being used to lobby governmental entities or officers or to pay for expenses related to memberships in organizations or associations.

- **Mar 8, 2007:** Rule H. Res. 215 passed House.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 215. (consideration: CR H2321-2330)
- **Mar 8, 2007:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 700 with 1 hour of general debate. Previous question shall be considered as ordered without intervening motions except motion to recommit with or without instructions. Measure will be considered read. Bill is open to amendments. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** House resolved itself into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union pursuant to H. Res. 215 and Rule XVIII.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** The Speaker designated the Honorable Michael R. McNulty to act as Chairman of the Committee.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** GENERAL DEBATE - The Committee of the Whole proceeded with one hour of general debate on H.R. 700.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** DEBATE - The Committee of the Whole proceeded with debate on the Kucinich amendment under the five-minute rule.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** DEBATE - The Committee of the Whole proceeded with debate on the Price(GA) amendment under the five-minute rule.
- **Mar 8, 2007:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on the Price (GA) amendment, the Chair put the question on adoption of the amendment and by voice vote, announced that the noes prevailed. Mr. Price (GA) demanded a recorded vote and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of the amendment until later in the legislative day.
