## Actions Timeline

- **Dec 6, 2007:** CONSIDERATION OF H. RES. 846 - By direction of the Committee on Rules, Mr. Welch called up H. Res. 846 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **Dec 6, 2007:** Mr. Flake raised a point of order against the provisions of H. Res. 846 on the grounds that it allows for an unfunded mandate. Pursuant to the rule, the Chair announced that the threshold for identifying specific language related to an unfunded mandate had been met and that the question would be put on the consideration of the resolution. Subsequently, the House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the question of consideration of H. Res. 846.
- **Dec 6, 2007:** On motion to consider the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 214 - 188 (Roll no. 1134).
- **Dec 6, 2007:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H14255-14259, H14260-14269)
- **Dec 6, 2007:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 846.
- **Dec 6, 2007:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 216 - 192 (Roll no. 1136). (consideration: CR H14768)
- **Dec 6, 2007:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 218 - 195 (Roll no. 1137).(text: CR H14255-14256)
