Summary (as of Jan 4, 2011)

(This measure has not been amended since it was passed by the Senate on December 2, 2010. The summary of that version is repeated here.)

Enacts title 41 of the United States Code into positive law to be entitled "Public Contracts."

Makes technical and conforming amendments. Increases the micro-purchase threshold for executive agency procurement purposes to \$3,000 (currently, \$2,500).
