Sets forth the rule for consideration of the Senate amendment to the bill (H.R. 2847) making appropriations for the Departments of Commerce and Justice, and Science, and Related Agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 4, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 4, 2010:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-426, by Ms. Matsui.
- **Mar 4, 2010:** The resolution makes in order a motion offered by the chair of the Committee on Ways and Means that the House concur in the Senate amendment to the House amendment to the Senate amendment with the amendment printed in the report. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the motion except those arising under clause 10 or rule XXI. The Senate amendment and the motion shall be considered as read. The resolution provides one hour of debate. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the motion to final adoption
- **Mar 4, 2010:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 169.
- **Mar 4, 2010:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H1115-1123)
- **Mar 4, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1137.
- **Mar 4, 2010:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 236 - 184 (Roll no. 87). (consideration: CR H1122-1123)
- **Mar 4, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 212 - 209 (Roll no. 88).(text: CR H1115)
