Summary (as of Apr 21, 2010)

Expresses the sense of the House of Representatives that: (1) access to public waters for recreational fishing and boating should be a national priority; (2) the final report of the Interagency Ocean Policy Task Force should include the promotion of recreational fishing and boating as a national priority; and (3) in implementing the Task Force's recommendations, the President should promote recreational fishing and boating.

- **Apr 22, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation.
- **Apr 21, 2010:** Introduced in House

- **Apr 21, 2010:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
