- **May 19, 2010:** Mr. McDermott moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.
- **May 19, 2010:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H3610-3612; text of measure as introduced: CR H3610-3611)
- **May 19, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 1339.
- **May 19, 2010:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. McDermott objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
