Summary (as of May 26, 2010)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5136) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2011 for military activities of the Department of Defense, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes; waiving a requirement of clause 6(a) of rule XIII with respect to consideration of certain resolutions reported from the Committee on Rules.

Actions Timeline

- **May 27, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1404.
- **May 27, 2010:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H3885)
- **May 27, 2010:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 1404, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the resolution, and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Lincoln Diaz-Balart demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceeding on agreeing to the resolution until later in the legislative day.
- **May 27, 2010:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H3887)
- **May 27, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 178 (Roll no. 307).(text: CR H3876)
- **May 27, 2010:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 178 (Roll no. 307). (text: CR H3876)
- **May 27, 2010:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **May 26, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **May 26, 2010:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-498, by Ms. Pingree (ME).
- **May 26, 2010:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 or rule XXI. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Armed Services now printed in the bill. No amendment to the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution and amendments en bloc described in section 3 of this resolution. The resolution waives a requirement with respect to consideration of certain resolutions.
- **May 26, 2010:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 201.
