111 SRES 483	Identical bill	Apr 21, 2010: Resolution agreed to in Senate without amendment and with a preamble by Unanimous Consent. (text: CR S2529)

Applauds the people of Serbia for their commitment to democracy, free markets, tolerance, and the rule of law.

Urges the European Council to adopt a clear position on Serbia's qualifications as a candidate country.

Recognizes Serbia's cooperation with the United States on issues such as democratization, anti-drug trafficking, anti-terrorism, human rights, regional cooperation, and trade.

Urges the government of Serbia to intensify efforts to capture and transfer at-large indictees Goran Hadzic and Ratko Mladic to the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY).
