Encourages parents to read with their children for at least 30 minutes on Read Across America Day.

- **Mar 3, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 146.
- **Mar 3, 2009:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Polis (CO) objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
