Actions Timeline

- **Jul 30, 2010:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-582, by Ms. Pingree (ME).
- **Jul 30, 2010:** General debate for H.R. 3534 shall be one hour and forty minutes. After general debate, the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. And, it shall be in order to consider as an original bill the amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in Part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying the resolution. Notwithstanding clause 11 of rule XVIII, no amendment to that amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in Part B of the report of the Committee on Rules. The rule also makes in order
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 229.
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H6462-6468)
- **Jul 30, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1574.
- **Jul 30, 2010:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H6468)
- **Jul 30, 2010:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 1574, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the ayes prevailed. Mr. Sessions demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of H.Res. 1574 until later in the legislative day.
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H6482)
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 220 - 194 (Roll no. 500). (text: CR H6462-6463)
