Summary (as of Feb 12, 2009)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of the conference report to accompany the bill (H.R. 1) making supplemental appropriations for job preservation and creation, infrastructure investment, energy efficiency and science, assistance to the unemployed, and State and local fiscal stabilization, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 13, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-17, by Ms. Slaughter.
- **Feb 13, 2009:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 11.
- **Feb 13, 2009:** The resolution provides 90 minutes of debate on the conference report. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the conference report except those arising under clause 9 of rule XXI and provides that the conference report be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against the conference report. The waiver does not affect the point of order available under clause 9 of rule XXI. Finally, the resolution provides one motion to recommit, if applicable.
- **Feb 13, 2009:** By the direction of the Committee on Rules, Mr. Perlmutter called up H.Res. 168 and asked for its immediate consideration. (consideration: CR H1524-1536)
- **Feb 13, 2009:** POINT OF ORDER - Mr. Dreier raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 168 because it violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H.Res. 168. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Feb 13, 2009:** On question of consideration of resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (consideration: CR H1524-1526)
- **Feb 13, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 168.
- **Feb 13, 2009:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 234 - 194 (Roll no. 66). (consideration: H1535-1536)
- **Feb 13, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 231 - 194 (Roll no. 67).(text: CR H1524)
- **Feb 13, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 231 - 194 (Roll no. 67). (text: CR H1524)
- **Feb 13, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Feb 12, 2009:** Introduced in House
