Summary (as of Dec 8, 2010)

Recognizes and supports the efforts of Welcome Back Veterans to augment the services provided by the Departments of Defense (DOD) and Veterans Affairs (VA) in providing timely and world-class care for veterans and members of the Armed Forces suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and related psychiatric disorders.

Encourages the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish innovative public-private partnerships for the treatment and research of PTSD in teaching hospitals across the country.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 14, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **Dec 8, 2010:** Mr. Donnelly (IN) moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution, as amended.
- **Dec 8, 2010:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H8102-8104)
- **Dec 8, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 1746.
- **Dec 8, 2010:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Donnelly (IN) objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
- **Dec 8, 2010:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H8151-8152)
- **Dec 8, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution, as amended Agreed to by recorded vote (2/3 required): 409 - 0 (Roll no. 621).(text: CR H8102)
- **Dec 8, 2010:** On motion to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution, as amended Agreed to by recorded vote (2/3 required): 409 - 0 (Roll no. 621). (text: CR H8102)
- **Dec 8, 2010:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Dec 1, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 1, 2010:** Referred to House Veterans' Affairs
- **Dec 1, 2010:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Dec 1, 2010:** Referred to House Armed Services
