Summary (as of Oct 21, 2009)

International Civil Rights Center and Museum Commemorative Coin Act - Directs the Secretary of the Treasury to mint and issue, during 2010, up to 1,000 \$1 coins in commemoration of the opening of the International Civil Rights Center and Museum in Greensboro, North Carolina.

Requires sales to include a \$10 surcharge per coin, to be paid to the International Civil Rights Center and Museum for program development and research.
