- **Feb 25, 2009:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2643-2656)
- **Feb 25, 2009:** By direction of the Committee on Rules, Mr. McGovern called up H. Res. 184 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **Feb 25, 2009:** POINT OF ORDER - Mr. Flake raised a point of order against the provisions of H. Res. 184 because it violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H. Res. 184. the House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Feb 25, 2009:** On question of consideration of the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 234 - 177 (Roll no. 83).
- **Feb 25, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 184.
- **Feb 25, 2009:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 393 - 25 (Roll no. 84). (consideration: CR H2655-2656)
- **Feb 25, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 398 - 24 (Roll no. 85).(text: CR H2643-2644)
- **Feb 25, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 398 - 24 (Roll no. 85). (text: CR H2643-2644)
- **Feb 25, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Feb 24, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 24, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-20, by Mr. McGovern.
- **Feb 24, 2009:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI.
