Summary (as of Apr 1, 2009)

Four Corners Television Access Act of 2009 - Amends federal copyright law and the Communications Act of 1934 to allow satellite or cable retransmission of signals of broadcast television stations located in the capital of a state to counties in that state if the counties meet specified criteria.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 2, 2009:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications, Technology, and the Internet.
- **Apr 1, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 1, 2009:** Referred to House Judiciary
- **Apr 1, 2009:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
