Summary (as of Mar 11, 2009)

(This measure has not been amended since it was introduced. The summary of that version is repeated here.)

Recognizes: (1) the Tibetan people for their perseverance in the face of adversity and for creating a democratic community in exile that sustains the Tibetan identity; and (2) the government and people of India for their generosity toward the Tibetan refugee population.

Calls upon: (1) the government of the People's Republic of China (PRC) to respond to the Dalai Lama's initiatives to find a lasting solution to the Tibetan issue; and (2) the Administration to recommit to a sustained effort to press the PRC to respect the Tibetans' identity and human rights.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 11, 2009:** Mr. Berman moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.
- **Mar 11, 2009:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H3307-3315)
- **Mar 11, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 226.
- **Mar 11, 2009:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **Mar 11, 2009:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H3317)
