Sets forth the rule for consideration of the resolution (H.Res. 279) providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Eleventh Congress.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 31, 2009:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H4141-4143)
- **Mar 31, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 294.
- **Mar 31, 2009:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H4143)
- **Mar 31, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H4141)
- **Mar 31, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H4141)
- **Mar 31, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Mar 30, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 30, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-63, by Mr. Hastings (FL).
- **Mar 30, 2009:** The rule provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on House Administration now printed in the resolution shall be considered as adopted. The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the resolution and provides that the resolution, as amended, shall be considered as read. the rule provides one motion to recommit which may not contain instructions.
- **Mar 30, 2009:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 34.
