Criminal History Background Checks Pilot Extension Act of 2009 - Amends the PROTECT Act to extend by 14 months the Child Safety Pilot Program (allowing certain volunteer organizations to obtain national and state criminal history background checks on their volunteers).

- **Feb 17, 2010:** Presented to President.
- **Feb 4, 2010:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H594)
- **Feb 4, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote.(text as passed House: CR 2/2/2010 H442)
- **Feb 4, 2010:** On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote. (text as passed House: CR 2/2/2010 H442)
- **Feb 4, 2010:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Feb 4, 2010:** Cleared for White House.
- **Feb 2, 2010:** Mr. Johnson (GA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Feb 2, 2010:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H442-443)
- **Feb 2, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on S. 2950.
- **Feb 2, 2010:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Johnson (GA) objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
- **Jan 26, 2010:** Received in the House.
- **Jan 26, 2010:** Message on Senate action sent to the House.
- **Jan 26, 2010:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
- **Jan 25, 2010:** Introduced in Senate
- **Jan 25, 2010:** Passed/agreed to in Senate: Introduced in the Senate, read twice, considered, read the third time, and passed without amendment by Unanimous Consent.(consideration: CR S203; text as passed Senate: CR S203)
