Summary (as of Jun 19, 2009)

Directs the Secretary of Defense to: (1) ensure the videotaping or other electronic recording of each strategic intelligence interrogation of any person in the custody or control of DOD or under detention in a DOD facility; (2) develop and adopt videotaping or recording guidelines; and (3) submit such guidelines to the defense committees.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 19, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Referred to House Armed Services
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Referred to House Intelligence (Permanent)
