Summary (as of Jul 23, 2009)

Wage Theft Prevention Act - Amends the Portal-to-Portal Act to toll the statute of limitations for bringing a cause of action for unpaid minimum wages, unpaid overtime compensation, or liquidated damages under the Fair Standards Act and certain other Acts, starting from the time the Secretary of Labor notifies an employer of the initiation of an investigation regarding the cause of action until such employer is notified of its conclusion.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 22, 2009:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Workforce Protections.
- **Jul 23, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 23, 2009:** Referred to House Education and Labor
- **Jul 23, 2009:** Referred to the Committee on Education and Labor, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 23, 2009:** Referred to House Judiciary
