Summary (as of May 6, 2010)

Drug Trafficking Safe Harbor Elimination Act of 2010 - Amends the Controlled Substances Act to provide that anyone who enters into a conspiracy within the United States to possess or traffic in controlled substances outside the United States, or aids or abets such offenses, shall be subject to the same penalties for conspiracy as if the criminal acts resulting from such conspiracy took place within the United States.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 15, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **May 6, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **May 6, 2010:** Referred to House Judiciary
- **May 6, 2010:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
