Sets forth the rule for consideration of the Senate amendment to H.R. 1256 (Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act).

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 12, 2009:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H6623-6630)
- **Jun 12, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 532.
- **Jun 12, 2009:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H6630)
- **Jun 12, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H6623)
- **Jun 12, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H6623)
- **Jun 12, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jun 11, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 11, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-145, by Mr. Polis (CO).
- **Jun 11, 2009:** Waives all points of order against consideration of the motion except those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI. Provides that the Senate amendment shall be considered as read. Although the rule waives all points of order against consideration of the motion (except those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI), the Committee is not aware of any points of order against the motion. The waiver of all points of order (except those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI) is prophylactic.
- **Jun 11, 2009:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 69.
